



## Data Management Case Study

### LibPAS as a “Data Lake”

#### Summary

Since 2012, Markham Public Library’s (MPL) use of data to guide organizational decisions has dramatically increased. As MPL’s organizational needs rapidly changed, the requirement for data analysis tools have also continued to change. Counting Opinions’ LibPAS and LibSat solutions have continued to serve important purposes in MPL’s data toolbox.

The greatest functionality of LibPAS for MPL is acting as a “data lake”. In this way, LibPAS functions as MPL’s official data book of record and provides consistency for historical/archival statistics. Data recorded in LibPAS include programs, volunteers, public access information, other usage and textual data, etc. LibPAS housed data are crucial when executing year-over-year analyses, which has been especially important post-Covid.
